Inspector Certification Examination Event:

Dear Candidate:

PLEASE make sure that you register for the event, pay your required fees and complete your application for the level of inspector certification you are seeking. The application must be completed and sent to <u>info@prcainfo.org</u> at least 30 days prior to the event (by December 19, 2023).

IMPORTANT: You must have your regular eye exam and color blindness test completed within one month of the event and send the results along with a copy of the Certificate of Insurance for the services you intend to provide to <u>info@prcainfo.org</u> in order to be tested.

A color blindness test can be done online at Pilestone.com/pages/color-blind-test. This online test will provide you with an emailed result page, print this out and submit it with the above.

The candidate should review the PRCA Certification Program Policies and Code of Ethics and other information at www.prcainfo.org. Click on the Resources then Certification tabs then click the desired document. The Program policy covers what subjects and material is on the tests.

For the practical test portion of the program candidates for Level II or Level III certification <u>must bring their own</u>:

- PRCA Approved full-body harness,
- PRCA Approved helmet,
- PRCA approved lanyards,
- PRCA approved connectors,
- The tools that they commonly utilize for their inspections (e.g. torque wrenches, tensiometers, etc.)
- Also, an example of the inspection report forms that you utilize.

If you also intend to apply for the Inspector Supervisor Endorsement, you must complete the Supervisor Endorsement application found in the Certifications folder at www.prcainfo.org. This application should be submitted with your application for the Inspector Certification, but will be accepted on site. <u>The Supervisor Endorsement fee</u> is \$35.00 and will be collected at the testing site.

You must have a photo ID with you when you arrive at the Keystone Camp and Conference Center training/testing rooms.

Exam Preparatory Sessions

January 17,2024, Wednesday, start 10: 00 AM – 6:00PM (Lunch break 1:00 – 2:15 P.M.) this event will provide an overview of:

- How Inspectors are to apply the ANSI/PRCA 1.0-.3-2014 American National Safety Standards, and other relevant industry standards and regulations.
- Proper documentation of an inspection.
- Examples of Inspection related tools and equipment.
- Examples of issues that may be noted during an inspection.
- Safety requirements for Inspectors.
- How inspectors can protect themselves in reports.
- Examples of the type of questions on the test.

It is required that you bring your licensed, printed, or electronic copies, of the ANSI/PRCA 1.0-.3-2014 and ASTM-2959-23B Standard Practice for Aerial Adventure Courses and other suggested materials to this session and to the exam. To obtain these standards / materials see the information at the end of this document.

Inspector Certification Written Exam

January 18, 2024, Thursday, are the open book written tests. Start time 10:00AM until all candidates have finished the written test. You may bring calculators, laptops and cellular phones to the test site.

- The Level 1 test is required for all candidates.
- After completion of the Level I test, we will take a short break (possibly a lunch break) and then begin the Level II test for those who have applied for Level II or III.

Inspector Certification Practical Exam

January 21, 2023, Start 10.00 A.M. The practical exam will be conducted on the Keystone challenge courses and equipment. The intent of this portion of the PRCA testing is to ensure that candidates can safely climb and inspect at height and to provide the opportunity for the inspector to demonstrate their inspection skills and knowledge. Along with documenting their findings of course/equipment compliance with the PRCA American National Safety Standards.

You must bring your inspection equipment to this session. Harness, helmet, lanyards, connectors, tools and writing implements and be properly attired to perform an inspection.

Candidates are permitted to attend any conference events on Friday and Saturday without additional costs.

Granting Certifications:

The Certification Examination Board (CEB) will grade tests after the event. Successful candidates will receive a 2-year Professional Ropes Course Certification as a Level I, II or III in their areas of expertise within 90 days; as long as the PRCA has received a current Certificate of Insurance naming the Professional Ropes Course Association, 6260 E. Riverside Blvd. #104, Rockford, Illinois 61111 as an additional insured on the candidate's policy. This COI must be renewed annually and forwarded to the PRCA while certified as an Inspector.

Unsuccessful candidates will be notified and may reapply for future certification events.
